Recent trends in oral cancer have heightened the importance of a proper oral cancer screening protocol for all medical and dental professionals. Oral Cancer has risen each of the past seven years, and the deforming disease is now affecting patients with no traditional risk factors. Due to a 225% increase in HPV related oropharyngeal cancers, oral cancer is occurring in younger populations, changing the perception of who to screen.

With the need for a new oral cancer screening protocol, adjunctive screening options will be covered in detail. This course will introduce recent & emerging technologies for early discovery of oral cancer, including fluorescence technology & quantitative cytology along with the importance of proper implementation. Clinical examples of these procedures will also be provided.

Hot Stuff: The Fire Within The Dangers of Oral Inflammation

One hundred million Americans are infected with periodontal disease. It is recognized to increase risk for diabetes, heart disease, stroke and other systemic diseases. Current scientific evidence links periodontal disease to a myriad of health problems, such as cardiovascular disease, diabetes, rheumatoid arthritis, cancer, respiratory disease and pregnancy complications.

As evidence of the multiple connections between periodontal disease and systemic disease becomes well established, it is imperative that every dental professional learn how periodontal disease and systemic diseases are linked. New clinical procedures must be established to address risk assessment and treatment protocols with the focus on whole body health, not just oral health.

This course will cover the foundational principles of the oral-systemic link and practical applications of the knowledge for the dental clinician. Entire dental teams are encouraged to attend, as knowledge of the connection between oral disease and total body health is imperative for all members of a wellness based dental practice.
